Board Profiles

In the last edition, I profiled three members of the board and promised to profile three more in each edition. As I said in the last edition, pick up the resume of any Bay Isles board member and you're going to feel the weight of many leadership positions in business, government and philanthropic organizations.

Larry Hall, Editor

Bob Coyne, Secretary

Bob may be the Dean of association leadership in Bay Isles. He's been the President of Building VI in Grand Bay for 19 years, was President of the Grand Bay board and is the longest serving member of the Bay Isles Board, on which he now serves as Secretary.

If you enjoy our Beach Club, it's because Bob has been overseeing it for all of us for many years. You may also know Bob as past president of the LBKC Tennis Association. He's also an active volunteer for the All Faiths Food Pantry at Tuttle Elementary School.

Bob graduated from Boston University, has an MBA from BU and taught at Somerville High School, in Massachusetts for 25 years. He is an OCS graduate of the United States Naval Submarine School leading to service on three submarines during his naval career.

He and Susan have been married for sixty years and have lived on LBK for twenty-seven years.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

What more should we do to improve our safety on Bay Isles' roads and sidewalks. It is a "we" question because most of the answer lies with how each of us respects the speed limits, the stop signs, crosswalks and the safety of our fellow members.

The challenge for the board is the few members who choose not to do that and put us in the position of having to add another layer of protection for the majority of us.

The facts are, some members don't just exceed the speed limit, they exceed it, by a lot...50 mph or more. Some members don't just slide through a stop sign or a cross walk marked with flashing lights, as members are entering them. They totally ignore them.

The most recent call to AMI was from a mother pushing a stroller who had started the warning lights at the cross walk, the oncoming car had plenty of time to stop and still blew through it as the mother started across.

Doing nothing is not an option for the board. The safety committee is considering options (speed tables, speed cameras that record licenses, others). They will be openly discussed with association representatives.

Terry Notari, Director

Terry and Carole arrived in Bay Isles as part-timers in 1990 and then full-time in 1995. They were married in 1960 and have a daughter, son and four grandsons.

A 27-year career with IBM included VP of the International Group. From 1989-1996 he was an officer and Senior Vice President of System Software Associates.

Like many of our board members, public service has been a critical part of Terry's background. From 1987-1988 he managed the Presidential Commission for the Celebration of the 200th Anniversary of the United States Constitution, reporting to Chief Justice Warren Burger.

In 1997, he joined the board of the Harbor Association and for the last two years has been a Bay Isles board member. As an avid sailor and fisherman with a sincere interest in the well-being of our perimeter channel and mangroves, he has been an extraordinary leader in advocating for our waterway system on behalf of us all.

Blake Whitney, Director

Blake is one of those board members who is still building a long, successful and fascinating career as an innovator and entrepreneur...his is in the health care industry.

It's hard not to be impressed when you see that, in 1998, he was a founder and first President of WebMD, an idea and business model that was in the forefront of creating the web as an essential service and became the testing ground and model for many companies that followed. That was not his first success or his last. Drop back in time and, in 1988, he was President of MedStar and then add at least 18 medical companies over the years in which he has been a founder, leader, investor or advisor...and today Vice Chairman of Vextra Health.

Life in Bay Isles started with the purchase of a boat slip in 2004, with no intention of buying a home. By 2008, he and his wife, were homeowners in Weston Point Court, then a Board member and now a board member of both the Longboat Key Club Moorings and the Bay Isles Association

IS IT WORTH SAVING 17 SECONDS?

If you drive the speed limit (30 mph) from Grand Bay to the stop sign at the north gate it takes 2 minutes, 51 seconds. At five miles over the speed limit (35 mph) you save 17 seconds.

If you drive the speed limit from the South Gate to the gate at the marina it takes 1 minute, 56 seconds. At five miles over the speed limit, you save 12 seconds.
